Tours of the sugarbush and maple syruping process begin every 15 minutes at the Badger Den conference room located next to the main parking lot. Following a short video, a volunteer guide will give you a “sample” tour. You will learn about Native American history, how to tap a tree, how pioneers made maple syrup, and watch sap as it is being boiled.

Tours last approximately 30 minutes.

There will be horse-drawn wagon rides from 10am - 2pm.

The wildlife exhibit and museums will be open until 2pm.

The Poynette Optimist Club will be serving an “all you can eat” pancake breakfast at the Resident Center Lodge from 8am until noon.

The Friends of MacKenzie will be offering refreshments and selling maple sundaes and souvenirs, with a raffle taking place at 1pm.
